

## **Eric J. Oxfeld**

Eric J. Oxfeld currently serves as President of UWC – Strategic Services on Unemployment & Workers Compensation (formerly called UBA, Inc.), a post he has held since November 1996. Oxfeld also serves as President of UWC’s research arm, the National Foundation for Unemployment Compensation & Workers’ Compensation. Effective December 1, 2006, he will join the staff of the International Workers’ Compensation Foundation as Executive Director.

Oxfeld previously served as Assistant General Counsel at the American Insurance Association (AIA), where he headed the Law Department workers’ compensation team and was activity involved in the enactment of workers’ compensation reform legislation nationwide. At the AIA, he was Secretary to the Workers’ Compensation Committee. Oxfeld has also served as Senior Congressional Officer at the U.S. Department of Labor (working with the Employment & Training Administration and Employment Standards Administration), Manager of Health Care and Employee Benefits at the Chamber of Commerce of the United States (where he edited the *Analysis of Workers’ Compensation Laws*), and Assistant State Legislative Counsel at the American Bankers Association.

Oxfeld is a member of the District of Columbia bar. He holds a J.D. degree from the National Law Center at George Washington University and a B.A. degree from Yale University in Russian Studies. Oxfeld is married, has two children, and currently resides in Virginia.
